


MRA Join two Routes (Gold Membership Only)

So, what if I had two routes and I wanted to make one bigger route for a day's ride out?? Simply follow the easy steps below. ("WARNING/DISCLAIMER" This is a gold members feature only)


Example - you have two routes as shown below, Aldeburgh (Aldeburgh to Fordham) and Aldeburgh (Ely to Aldeburgh) that you would like to join together to make into one 155 mile day ride out.




1. First step is to open and make a copy of the route you are going to use, then open the copied route (ideally make sure they are the same default map type) The ones in the diagram are both TomTom.




2. On the opened Aldeburgh (Aldeburgh to Fordham) copy route above, you will need to click the three lines = at the top left side of the page.




- 3. The following view above will open, click on "Routes".


5. You will be presented with the following screen, click the add button (As shown above).



6. Direct yourself to the relevant folder where the files are stored, For example as above we have added the Aldeburgh (Ely to Aldeburgh) route.




7. You now have to press the + button (As shown above).



- 8. It will then ask you where you want to merge this route with the other, there are two options:
 - a. Beginning
 - b. End

As in this example we want to go from Ely to Alderburgh for coffee & cake and then end up at a friend's house in Fordham, so we will put this route at the beginning, then press the "Merge" button.



9. You are now left with your final route (shown above).

Off course there is no limit to this feature. You may wish to add three or more routes together just repeat step 5 above and onwards, give it a try.

Unfortunately, this process overwrites the original first loaded file, so if you want to keep this file intact then rename it or make a copy of the original before joining them together
