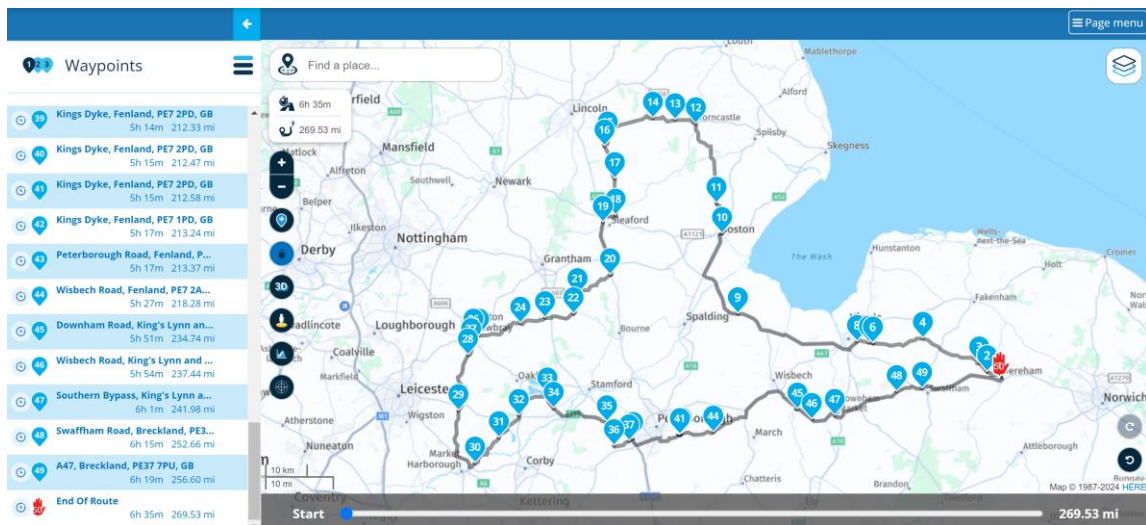




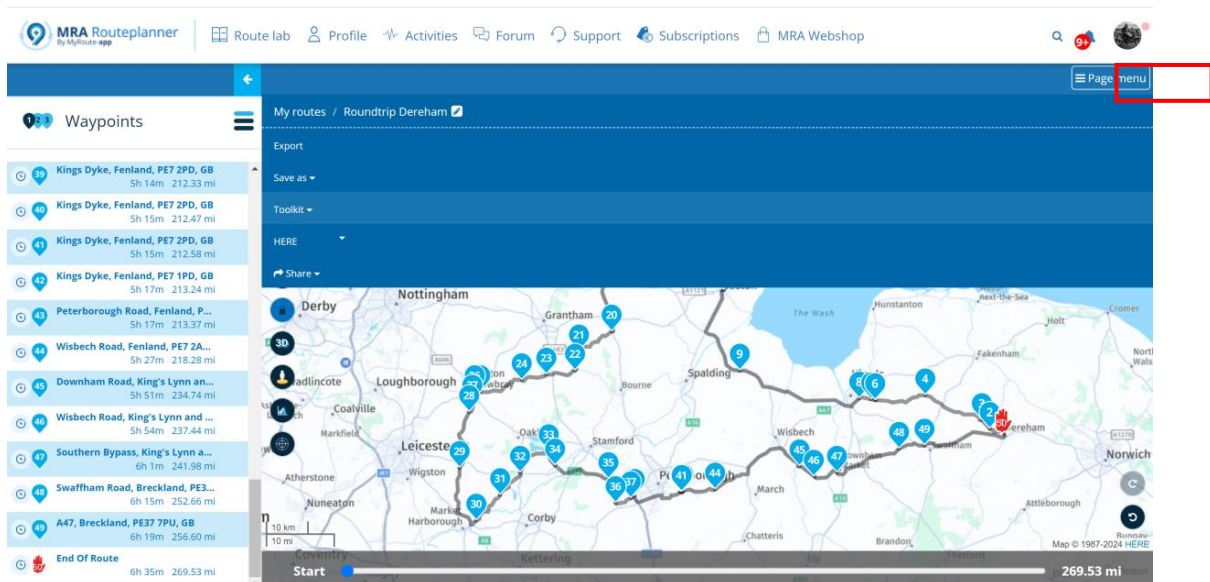
MRA Split a Route - **Gold Membership Only**



- You have a route with say 50 waypoints, but you want to split it into two GPX files to use on your Garmin Navigator 5. As a GN5 user you will know you can only have a maximum of 27 waypoints per GPX file.....here's what to do.

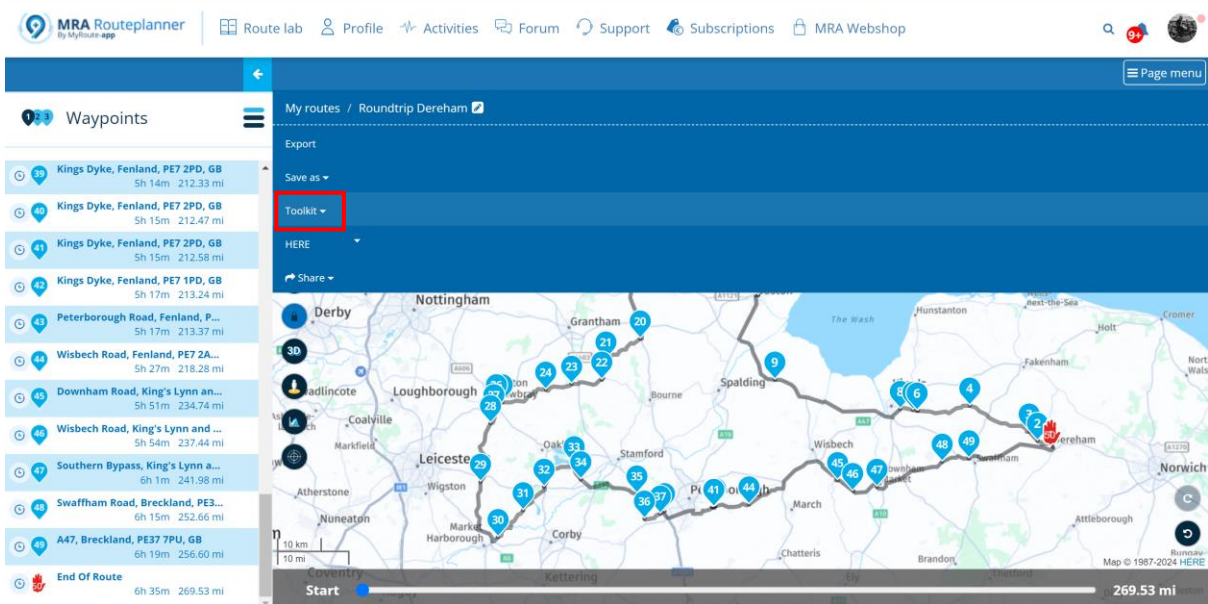


1. Open your route that requires splitting in MRA (like the one shown above).

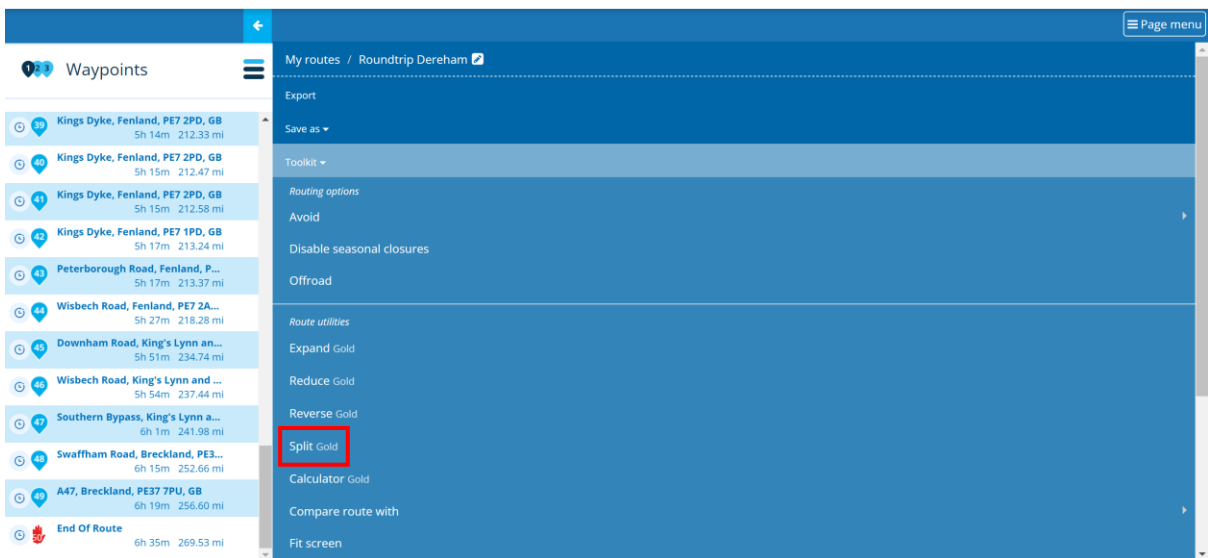


2. In the top right of your screen click the “Page menu” button (as shown above).

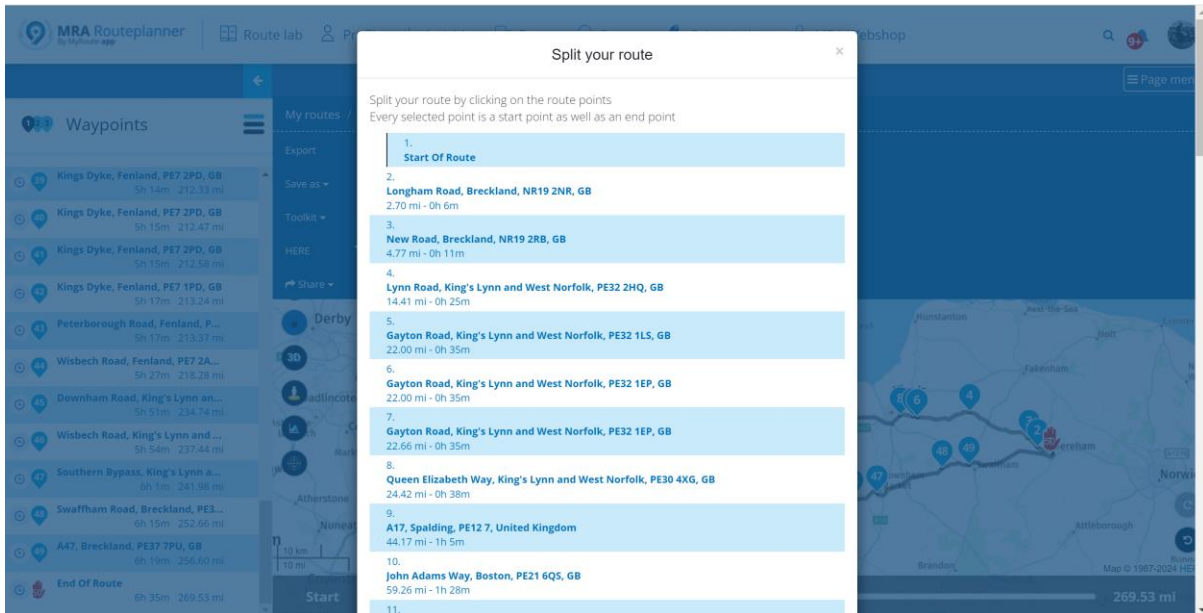


3. Under the sub menu click to expand the “Toolkit” menu (as shown above).

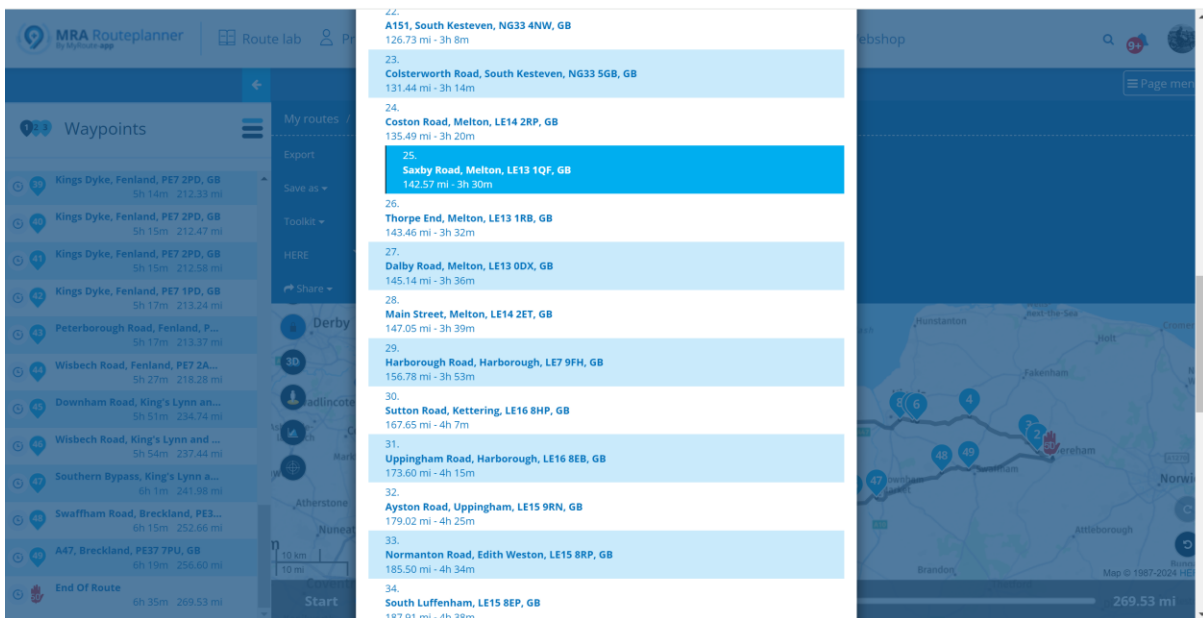


4. Click “Split” (as shown above).

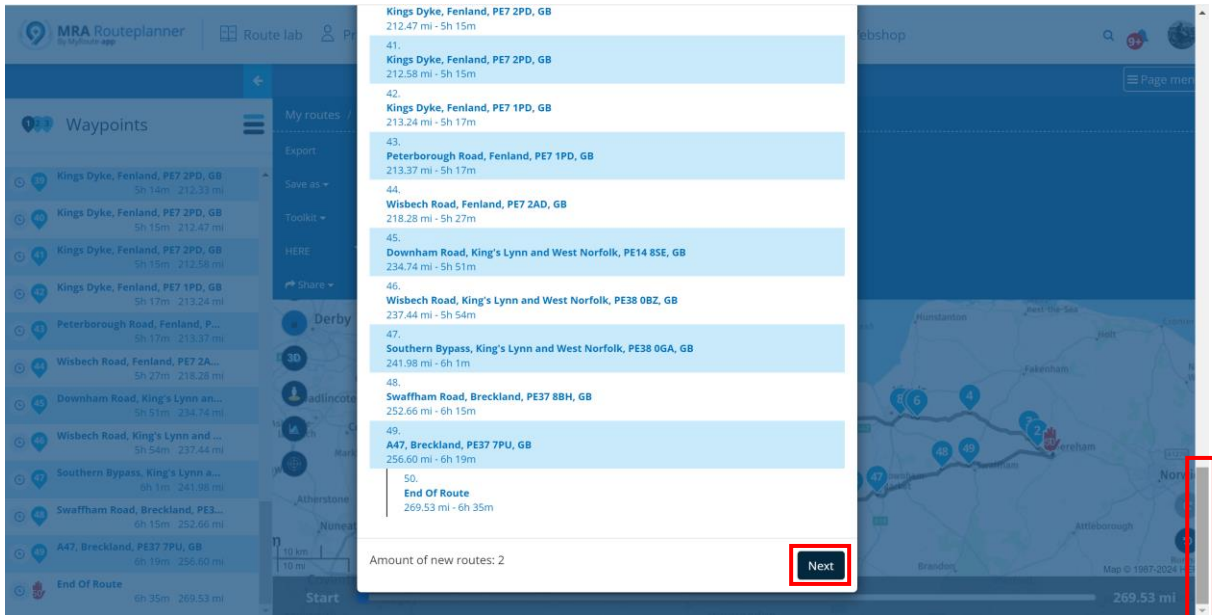


5. The following window will open (As shown above).

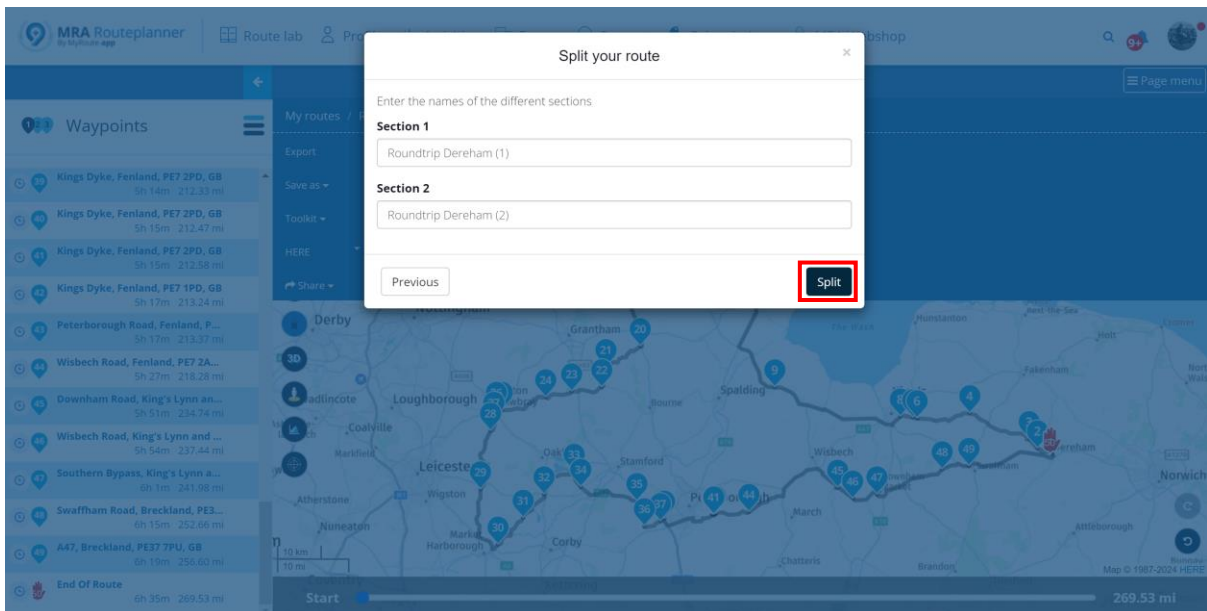


6. As an example, with this particular route I am choosing to split it into two GPX files with 25 waypoints in each. If you click on waypoint 25 it will become highlighted and tabs in slightly (as shown above).

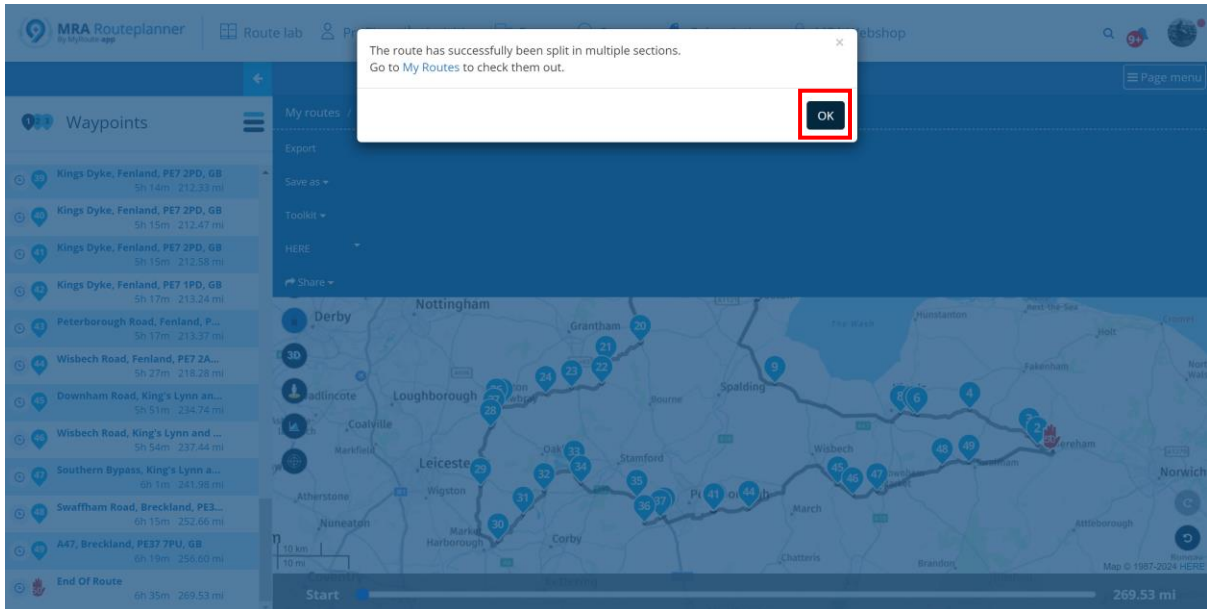


7. Using the scroll bar at the right scroll down to the bottom, and then click the Next button.

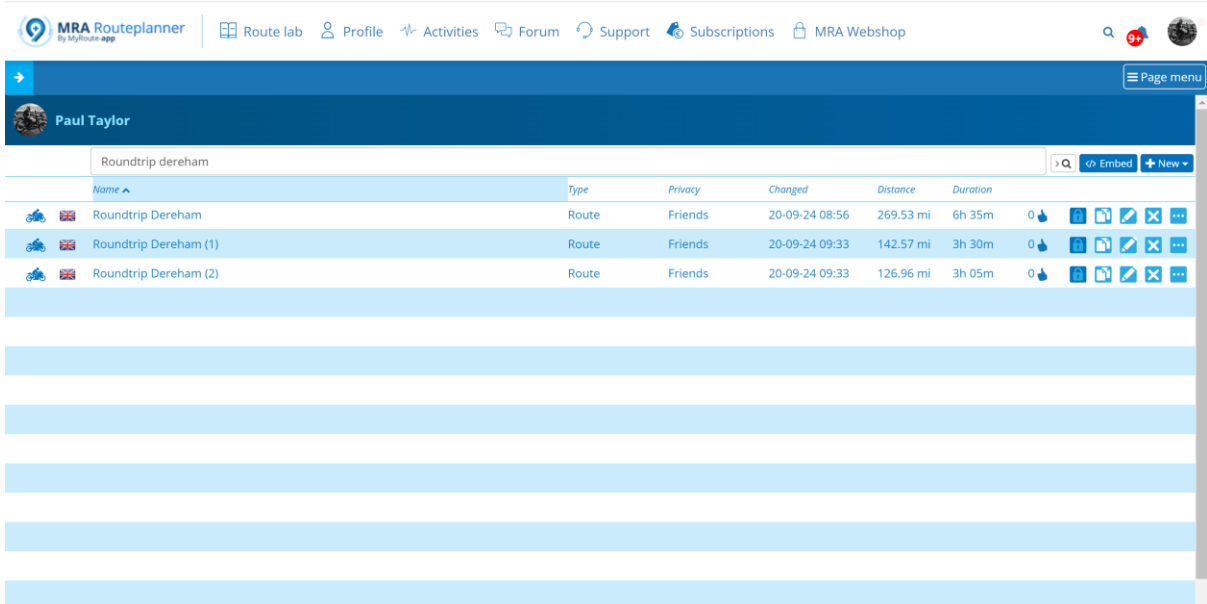


8. You will then be presented with the above screen, here you can rename the two files that will be generated. When you have made your edits or leave as they are and happy with naming convention, press the 'Split' Button at the bottom right (as shown above).

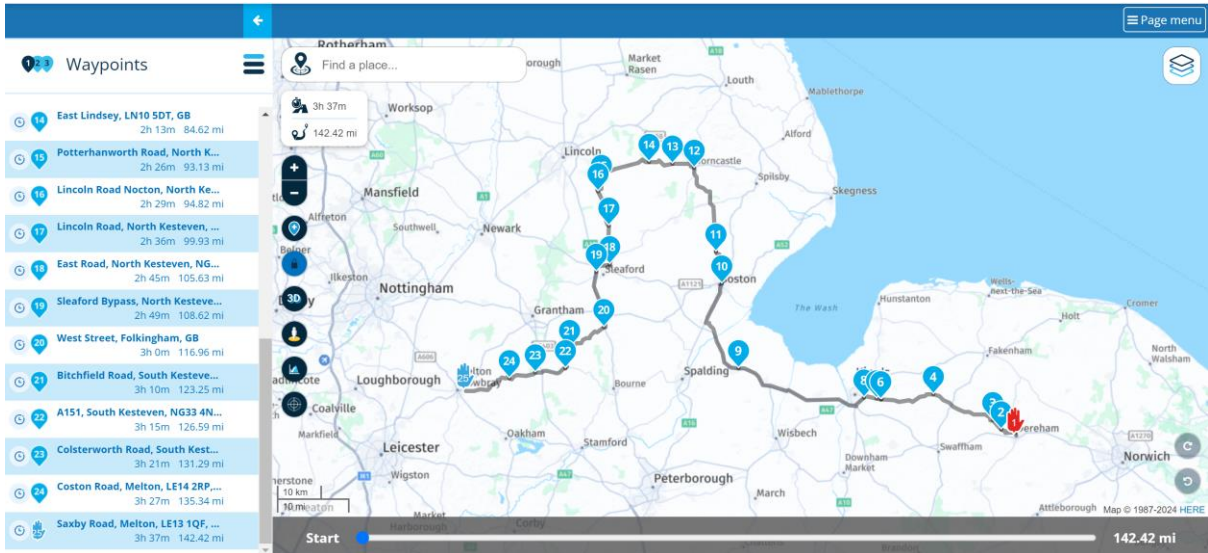


9. Press the OK button - both the new GPX files are now generated and are normally stored in the same directory folder as the original that is left untouched. (see screenshot below)

11. If you click to open the new GPX files you will see that there are 25 waypoints in each of the files.

Congratulations you have now successfully split your first route.

 - Of course, you might want to choose to split a GPX into **Three** or even **Four** files if it has even more waypoints, if so simply just follow from step six listed above. By selecting two individual waypoints for splitting it into three GPX files, or three individual waypoints for splitting it into four GPX files it is as simple as that.
